What is NIRIS?

Your Lions of Illinois Foundation has partnered with the Northern Illinois Radio Information Service (NIRIS). NIRIS is a division of Northern Public Radio, the public broadcasting service of Northern Illinois University. NIRIS is a unique broadcast service which provides current print information to blind and print-impaired citizens of northern Illinois.

How Does it Work and Who Qualifies for a Receiver?

Programming is transmitted on a sub-carrier (SCA) frequency of WNIJ. A special receiver, which looks like a small table radio, can be used to hear the NIRIS programming. **Any person who is unable to read, hold a book, or turn a page because of a visual, physical, or learning disability may borrow a receiver.** Listeners do not have to be legally blind to receive programming. Criteria for eligibility are similar to those used by the Library of Congress Talking Book Service. These receivers are loaned free of charge to eligible listeners at home, in hospitals, and in nursing homes. **Additionally, NIRIS programming is streamed for free at WNIJ.org and on the WNIJ mobile app.**

What do NIRIS Listeners Hear?

Listeners can keep up to date with readings of newspapers, food and shopping ads, books, popular magazines, and special interest programs. A sample of the more than 25 newspapers read each week includes the *Rockford Register Star*, *DeKalb Chronicle*, *Chicago Tribune*, *Chicago Sun Times*, *New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, and *Christian Science Monitor*.



The University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences at the Illinois Eye and Ear Infirmary is a global leader in providing eyecare, and routinely performs the field's most advanced and complex procedures such as femtosecond laser assisted cataract surgery, Boston Keratoprosthesis implantation, various microinvasive glaucoma surgeries, endolaser cyclophotocoagulation, corneal limbal stem cell transplantation, advanced care for dry eye and ocular graft versus host disease, and advanced intraocular lens fixation techniques. One area that truly exemplifies the Department's role as a local and global leader for serving those who are most in need is our Pediatric Ophthalmology & Adult Strabismus Service.



Dr. Nathalie Azar, Director of the Pediatric Ophthalmology & Adult Strabismus Service

Directed by Dr. Nathalie Azar, the Pediatric Ophthalmology & Adult Strabismus Service offers general pediatric eye care, including exams for newborns and children up to 18 years of age. The doctors in this service specialize in strabismus (eye alignment disorders) in children as well as in adults. The Department also provides other specialty clinics treating sight threatening children's eye disorders, including pediatric retinal disorders, pediatric glaucoma,

pediatric cataracts, and genetic, neurocutaneous, and neuro-ophthalmologic disorders. Along with three full-time and three part-time pediatric ophthalmologists, additional care providers include pediatric retina specialists, pediatric neuro-ophthalmology specialists, and certified orthoptists. This interdisciplinary team allows the Pediatric Ophthalmology & Adult Strabismus Service to provide the best care for even the most complex cases.





In addition to serving as a local referral center for pediatric ophthalmology, the UIC Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences partners with the Chicago Bulls to offer free annual eye screening to underserved members of the community. This event provides invaluable eye care to many children and families who might otherwise not have access to it.



The UIC Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences is also deeply committed to treating and curing global pediatric eye conditions through clinical and educational outreach, innovative research, and advocacy. Our faculty has provided direct ophthalmological care, education, and research throughout the world: their work includes Zika Research in Recife, Brazil and programs in eight countries addressing retinopathy of prematurity (ROP) - one of the world's leading causes of infant blindness. The Department is a member of the International Pediatric Ophthalmology & Strabismus Council (IPOSC), the International Agency for the Prevention of Blindness (IAPB), the World Association of Eye Hospitals (WAEH) and we partner with Orbis International, IPOSC, Helen Keller International, and the Foundation for Ophthalmological Care from the United States (FOCUS) to establish programs for children at risk of developing blindness from ROP.

The Pediatric Ophthalmology & Adult Strabismus Service at the UIC Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences looks forward to continued commitment to all those in need.




Map shows countries where the UIC Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences is involved in ROP research and care.



Established in 1947, Eversight is a network of community-based eye banks that serves as the largest nonprofit provider of donated tissue for sight-restoring cornea transplants in the United States. We serve thousands of Illinois, New Jersey, Connecticut, Ohio, and Michigan residents who need sight-restoring corneal tissue for transplantation every year.



Since the founding of the eye bank, local Lions Clubs and individual supporters have been instrumental in Eversight's success. Lions Clubs support Eversight every step of the way, from recovering, evaluating and providing donated eye



tissue for transplantation and supporting donation education, to supporting research into the causes and cures of blinding eye conditions and providing humanitarian aid people around the world in need of corneal transplantation. In 2020, support from the Lions and other community partners allowed Eversight to work with 1,690 Illinois residents who gave the gift of sight as eye tissue donors and 1,269 Illinois residents to receive sight-restoring transplants, including patients who received charitable Gift of Sight support that either partially or fully offset the costs of surgery. All ticket proceeds benefit Eversight's Dr. John E. Randolph Memorial Fund, established in 2007 to provide financial assistance for Bloomington-Normal area patients unable to afford sight-restoring transplants. The late Dr. Randolph was a Bloomington cornea surgeon and medical director of the former BroMenn-Watson Gailey Eye-Bank, founded by national recognized ophthalmologist Dr. Watson Gailey in 1952.

Since it was established in 2011, Night for Sight has raised awareness and hundreds of thousands of dollars for sight-restoring transplantation in the Bloomington-Normal community. After a three-year event hiatus, we are excited to host Night for Sight again in 2021!

In June 2021, the Wheaton Lions Charities, Inc. awarded Eversight a generous grant in the amount of \$3,000 for continued operations in Illinois, where Eversight is a State Project. Including this gift, the Wheaton Lions have invested more than \$20,000 in philanthropic support to Eversight over the years.

Lions International has strong roots in Illinois, being founded in Chicago in 1917. The Wheaton Lions Club was established not long after in 1923. As strong advocates for restoring the gift of sight, Lions Clubs have supported Eversight at over \$140,000 annually.


