Happy Spring Lions,

With the warmer weather comes more of Lions Club outdoor events, like Walks, Easter Egg Hunts, and Flower Sales. Here is what is happening at our Foundation Office.

Our Mobile Screening Unit is out traveling throughout Illinois performing retinal and hearing screenings. If you would like to schedule a screening, please check our Mobile screening Unit calendar on our website. You can also fill out the hosting form, which is also located on the website. The online form is the quickest way for the Foundation Office to receive your hosting request. A big thank you to LCIF for the additional funds to purchase additional hearing screening equipment. Please see the back of this Lions Share for more information.

The Jacksonville Clinic screened over 33 students at their Spring Low-Vision Clinic on Monday, March 20th, and Tuesday, March 21st. Our Student Low Vision Clinics support over 300 students. For a donation of just \$290, a child receives over \$1,000 dollars' worth of services which includes: a comprehensive visual exam, telescopic eyeglasses, prescribed optical tools, and devices. In addition, the team assists each child as they address the daily challenges of growing up with vision loss. Students are scheduled throughout the school year to be seen by our partnering low-vision clinicians. All students receive these services for FREE, due to your continued support of this vital program.

The LIF Annual Breakfast Meeting will be held Sunday, May 21st at the Abraham Lincoln Hotel in Springfield, IL. Our Sight and Sound Sweepstakes winners will be drawn at that breakfast. Our last early bird drawing will be Wednesday, May 3rd. We will also have our annual "PARADE OF PLEDGES", this is an opportunity to spotlight your club and all the great things you have done and continue to do for the Lions of Illinois Foundation programs and services and your communities.

All pairs not shipped together in the same bag will be categorized as non-paired and will not be eligible for payment.



The Lions of Illinois Foundation partners with Spectrios Institute for Low Vision, the Illinois College of Optometry, and the Chicago Lighthouse for the Blind to provide a FREE comprehensive visual

evaluation to Illinois students in grades K-12.

Students are referred by special education staff employed by the Illinois Board of Education. The exams are performed by licensed optometrists that travel to the different screening locations throughout the state.





WTERNATION

The audiogram is a graph that shows what sounds you are able to hear and what sounds you cannot hear. Each mark on the audiogram is the softest sound you can hear - your threshold - for a particular frequency or pitch. Normal hearing people hear sounds that are 20 decibels (dB) or less at all the frequencies.

Heating loss can be described by the degree of loss - how loud sounds have to be for you to hear them - and the pattern of the thresholds shown on the audiogram. The degree of loss can be mild, moderate, severe, or profound

The speech area represents the sounds that make up everyday conversational speech. If your thresholds are all above the speech area, you hear all the sounds that are important for understanding speech. If your thresholds are all below the speech area, you hear none of the sounds in normal speech. If some of your thresholds are in or below the speech area, you are missing some of the sounds that are important for understanding everyday conversation.

Hearing loss is a symptom of a problem somewhere in the eac T can be in the outer eac, the middle eac, or the inner eac Some of these conditions can be treated with medication or surgery. Many people with hearing loss are helped by hearing aids. It is important to find out the cause of the hearing loss so that the appropriate treatment can be provided.
