

Since Candy Day was introduced by LIBAC in 1960, Lions have been seen Illinois asking for donations.




Today the Candy Day donations sent to the Lions of Illinois Foundation are used to support vision and hearing programs and services, continuing the legacy started over 64 years ago!

My Candy Day?

Candy day was created in 1960 to support programs for the visually impaired. Over the last 60 plus years, it has grown and at one point raised over \$1 million dollars per year. Through that time, the Candy Day Fundraiser continued to support more and more programs. Candy Day has evolved to include traditional street corner donations, underwriting and separate standalone events. Clubs throughout the state do Candy Day events at various times to maximize their engagement with their communities.

Today Candy Day is the largest fundraiser for the Lions of Illinois Foundation. Candy Day makes sure Foundation programs are fully funded. It makes sure that Camp Lions stays a free camp for kids and youth in Illinois. Funds from Candy Day ensure that students receive specialty low vision screenings and devices. The mobile unit continues to be out on the road doing screenings with funds from Candy Day. Long term partners like Leader Dog, Hadley School for the Blind, the Lions of Illinois Eye Research Institute (LIERI) and Eversight get yearly grants for programs from our Foundation because of Candy Day.

Why do we Lions participate in Candy Day? Funds raised from Candy Day touch every program the Lions of Illinois Foundation provides. It helps all of our partners to expand their impact. Candy day helps children get a good start to their life, for young people to choose their path forward and for adults to regain their mobility and independence. Candy Day allows the Foundation to increase the number of people we can help each year.





These awards would start 2024-2025 Lions year.

The awards will be given to the clubs that participate in Candy Day or Tootsie Pop Day.

CD-1 Club Award Criteria

- Each club that increases their gross donation by 5% over previous year's donation
- Must make a minimum gross donation of \$150.00
- Clubs will receive a CD1 patch for their first year
- Clubs will receive a chevron for each subsequent year

CD-100 Club Award Criteria

- Each club that increases their gross donation by 15% over previous year's donation
- Must make a minimum gross donation of \$600.00
- Clubs will receive a CD100 patch for their first year
- Clubs will receive a chevron for each subsequent year

CD-100% Candy Day District Award Criteria

- 100% of Clubs in a District participate in Candy Day or Tootsie Pop Day with a minimum donation of \$50
- For each District that achieves 100%, District Trustees and Governors will receive a Candy Day 100% pin

Continous Growth Awards

- Recognition for clubs that receive CD1 or CD100 several years in a row
- Certificate and Banner Patch
- Acknowledge at 5yrs, 10yrs, and 15yrs

Students are referred by special education staff employed by the Illinois Board of Education. The exams are performed by licensed optometrists that travel to the different screening locations throughout the state.
