Adult Low Vision



Your Foundation has provided Low Vision services to students throughout Illinois for over 20 years. Now, LIF is bringing these services to Low Vision Adults.

What is O&M Training?

Orientation and Mobility training focuses on instructing individuals who are blind or low vision with safe and effective travel skills through their environment. Individual O&M specialists can work for schools or government agencies or as private contractors.



If an Adult were to become blind or severely impaired, there would be no funding through government assistance or private insurance to assist them with everyday living skills, unless they are working toward a vocational goal.

An O&M specialist provides training designed to develop skills and concepts a blind or visually impaired person needs to travel safely and independently through their environment. O&M training focuses on cues that can be detected by a person who is blind or low vision to allow them to understand their location and how to navigate between familiar locations. O&M training is complex in structure and wide in scope.

Techniques communicated to the trainee vary based on the trainee's life situation. For example, techniques would differ between an individual learning to navigate city streets and a trainee living in a more rural area. Common techniques taught through O&M training include cane travel, locating objects, navigating street crossings, and more.

O&M training costs \$75 per hour, and a minimum 10-15 hours are needed for completion of an initial session.
