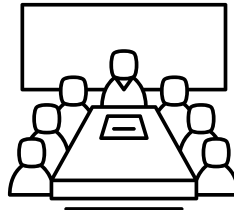

Together, we created a summer full of memories, friendship, and life-changing experiences. From the bottom of our hearts, thank you for your service and support.

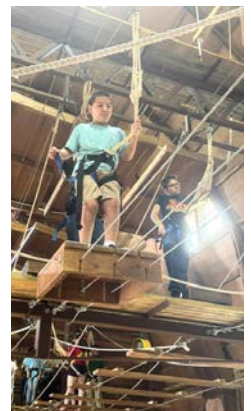

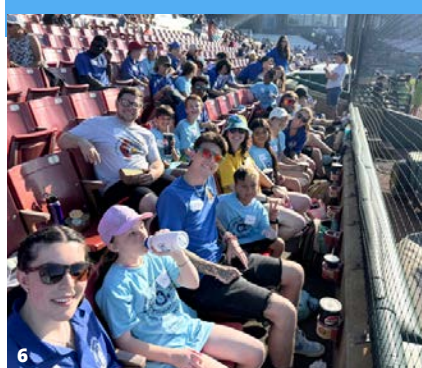

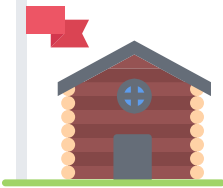

What it Takes to Run Camp Lions each Year



Lodging

We are very blessed to have great partnering campsites who keep Lodging costs at a minimum. Camp is actually 6 weeks, 1 week of Counselor Training and 5 weeks of Camp.



Food

There is only so much we can do about rising food costs, all of our camps offer some kind of buffet style food choices. Which range from \$12.50 - \$13 per meal per camper. This is comparable across all campsites. By providing food for the campers, counselors and guests, you could be absorbing up to \$900, in food costs for that one meal. *Nightly treats are still provided by Lions Clubs.*



Nursing

In the logistical world we now live in, it is important that we work with a reputable nursing agency to be able to accommodate the growing needs of our Campers. We hire nursing staff to cover the 5 weeks of Camp. We also hire a licensed CPR/First Aid Instructor for our Counselors Training Week. Nursing Staff averages \$5,000.00 per week.



Camp Site Activities

Along with 4 Square and Gaga Ball, our Campsites are now offering on-site activities like Rock Climbing, Ziplining, Paint Ball, Miniature Golf and Lakefront Fun like Paddle Boats, Canoeing, Water Slides and huge inflatable Rock Walls. While we continue to offer fun, interactive and unique activities for our campers, there is a main theme that runs throughout; and that is **safety**. The days of grabbing a bow and arrow and shooting a target are now replaced with a **licensed trainer** who provides training to our campers to ensure safety. For Rock Wall Climbing, **each camp hires an outside group who specialize in this activity**. Beach activities need to have a certain number of **lifeguards** and staff also to ensure safety. These additional on-site activities do incur additional costs but they also provide our Campers with an opportunity to build self-confidence and independence as they navigate these new adventures.



Special Activities

There is also an opportunity for some SPECIAL ACTIVITIES, these activities are off site and enrich the camper's Camp Lions experience in various ways. Baseball, Bowling and Horseback Riding are a few examples of Special Activities that could also require additional transportation to and from the special activity for campers and staff.



Activity Sponsorship

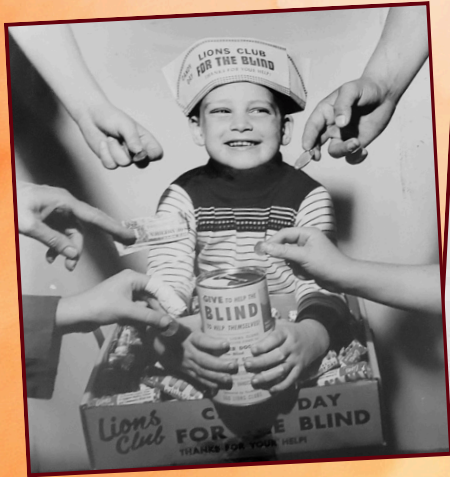

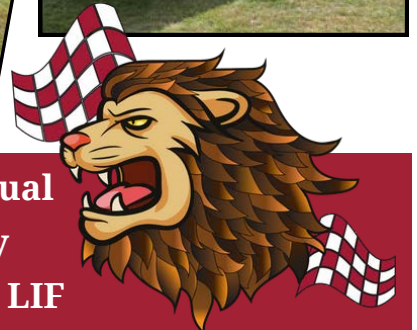

What is the Trustee Challenge?

The Trustee Challenge is a method of benchmarking the progress of our districts and clubs toward the annual fundraising goals for the Lions of Illinois Foundation.

How is the Trustee Challenge Calculated?

- Each year the Lions of Illinois Foundation calculates a per capita number that is based on the annual Programs and Services Budget divided by the total number of Lions within the state, this is based on membership as of July 1st (the first day of each new Lion's year).
- This year that number is \$72.35 per Lion.
- Each Club then gets a Goal based on the total number of Lions in their Club.

Example: A Lions Club with 30 members x \$72.35= \$2,170.50

- The goal for each District is built by combining all the Club Goals from that District.

What is the Challenge for Each District Trustee?

A Trustee is challenged with the task of helping clubs reach their goal by being active within the district:

- Speak at Club/District meetings to get acquainted with the Lions in their District and spread the word about LIF Programs and Services and how they positively impact their communities.
- Help organize and participate in Club/District fundraising events.

**Clubs that meet their goal will receive a certificate of recognition.
District Trustees will receive a certificate of recognition if the district meets their goal.**



Congratulations to Districts 1-F and 1-J for completing the Trustee Challenge for 2024/2025!

Trustees will be provided with quarterly reports on their progress toward the Trustee Challenge. The report will include information on how clubs are progressing towards the goal as well as how the district is progressing overall.
